Activity Description:

Essentials of Pediatric Palliative Care is designed for community pediatric providers, including physicians, APRN's, nurses, and social workers. The course is taught by the pediatric palliative care team at Oklahoma Children's Hospital. The three members of this team have a combined 18 years of experience in this field and are the only full time, full service pediatric palliative care providers in the state of Oklahoma. The three lectures comprising the course were specifically curated to be high yield to a community pediatric practice. The purpose of this course is to improve the care of chronic, complex pediatric patients in the community setting by equipping community caregivers with skills to better care for this population by addressing well known clinical practice gaps.

The course is divided into three modules:

Module 1: Introduction to Pediatric Palliative Care, Rachna May, MD

Module 2: Perinative Palliative Care, Mary Browning, MS, ARPN, CPNP-AC

Module 3: Grief and Loss – Tips and Tricks to Support Families after the Death of a Child, Cari Epperson, LCSW-P

Required hardware and software:

- **Operating Systems:** Any operating system that supports modern web browsers that adhere to the WC III standards.
- **Browsers:** For best performance and compatibility, we recommend using the latest version of Firefox, Chrome, or Microsoft Edge. The CloudCME™ administration system will run in Safari and the iOS browser, though performance and display of some items may vary.
