Dr. Tipple is originally from a rural Indiana farming community, received his undergraduate education at Butler University and his medical degree from Indiana University School of Medicine. After completing pediatric residency and neonatology fellowship at Columbus (now Nationwide) Children's Hospital, Dr. Tipple was an Assistant Professor in the Division of Neonatology for 8 years. During this time, he directed the Research Committee for the Neonatal-Perinatal Fellowship Program and developed a robust pulmonary and redox biology research program. In 2014, he was recruited to the University of Alabama at Birmingham as a Tenured Associate Professor and served as Director of the Neonatal Redox Biology Laboratory, Director of Faculty Development for the Division of Neonatology, and Director of the NIH-funded UAB College of Medicine Summer in Biomedical Sciences undergraduate research program.

In September, 2019, Dr. Tipple was recruited to the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center where he currently serves as Professor and Chief of the Section of Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine and holds the CHF Reba McEntire Endowed Chair in Neonatology. Dr. Tipple's scientific work has been continuously supported by NIH funding since 2004. He is excited to build upon the strengths of the Section of Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine and to harness the potential of Children's Hospital and OUHSC to support neonatal-perinatal care across the state of Oklahoma. As a passionate educator, mentor, and clinician-scientist, Dr. Tipple's academic passion is to foster interdisciplinary collaborations that will define the long-term impacts of surviving as a prematurely born infant, ultimately leading to the development of targeted therapies to improve outcomes.
