The Annual William K. Ishmael Rheumatology Symposium will be presented virtually by the Department of Medicine, Section of Rheumatology from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Friday, Oct. 1.**

The symposium aims to disseminate the latest in basic and clinical rheumatologic research to healthcare providers in the state of Oklahoma. This one-day event will feature a range of subject experts, including University of Oklahoma College of Medicine faculty as well as distinguished guest presenters.

Presentations will include a “meet the professor” concurrent sessions, conducted in a small-group discussion format. Interesting cases from first-hand clinical experience promise to be informative and beneficial.

Attendees will be asked to complete a questionnaire provided at the close of the activity to help evaluate its effectiveness.

Intended/Target Audience:

Physicians, Advanced Practice Registered Nurses, Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners and specialty physicians including: Allergy, Immunology, Family Medicine, General Medicine, Hematology, Immunology, Internal Medicine, Orthopedic Surgery & Rehabilitation, Pulmonary Medicine, Research, Rheumatology and Sleep Medicine.

Activity Description:

This intensive one day offering that includes a review and update on major subject areas in rheumatology. The faculty chosen to speak are recruited locally and from nationally recognized leaders in their fields. The topics are chosen from the prior year’s participant suggestions. The seminars are focused on practical diagnosis, treatment, and latest research in areas related to the successful delivery of rheumatology health care and patient outcomes. The University of Oklahoma College of Medicine faculty is nationally recognized for their expertise in the management of complex conditions that is unavailable elsewhere in the state, region or sometimes even the nation. This is a very fast-paced symposium with five lectures and five concurrent meet the professor sessions.

Each session will include time for questions and answers. The course combines best practice strategies and education through case studies and lectures,

Learning Objectives:

Upon completion of this activity, participants will improve their competency and performance by being able to:

1. Discuss if people receiving immunosuppressive drugs are more susceptible to initial infection with SARS-CoV-2.
2. Describe the outcomes of COVID-19 in immunosuppressed individuals.
3. Identify the rheumatology drugs that are effective for treating COVID-19.
4. Describe antibody response in our rheumatic patients.
5. Describe lupus nephritis screening and surveillance guidelines.
6. Identify lupus nephritis treatment guidelines.
7. Compare new lupus nephritis treatments.
8. Describe myositis specific auto-antibodies that define disease complications and predict response to therapies.
9. Describe how pregnancy outcomes in lupus data was assessed and interpreted.
10. Demonstrate how to implement pregnancy guidelines in the clinical care of patients.
11. Estimate risks of medication use during lupus pregnancies with risks of under treated disease.
12. Summarize the temporal changes in pregnancy outcomes in SLE as management paradigms have evolved.

Overall Professional Practice Gaps

- GAP 1.** Pregnancy in rheumatic conditions can lead to poor maternal and fetal outcomes. Health care providers may not be aware that evidence-based guidelines to manage pregnancy in rheumatology conditions have been recently published entitled: 2020 American College of Rheumatology Guideline(s) for the Management of Reproductive Health in Rheumatic and Musculoskeletal Diseases.
- GAP 2.** Physicians may be unaware of the multitude of rheumatic complications occurring after COVID-19, including long COVID, and vaccine responses on rheumatic medications, and outcomes of rheumatic patients that get COVID-19.
- GAP 3.** Lupus nephritis is difficult to treat but guidelines are available as well as new treatments. Physicians may be unaware that in 2019, the joint guidelines for the management of adult and pediatric lupus nephritis were updated by the European League Against Rheumatism and European Renal Association-European Dialysis and Transplant Association (EULAR/ERA-EDTA).
- GAP 4.** Health care providers may not be aware of the importance of myositis-specific autoantibodies and disease manifestations and response to medications.
