#### **GENERAL OBJECTIVES:**

Upon completion of this activity, participants will improve their competence and performance by being able to:

- Identify the new diagnostic modalities and the rationale for selection of those that are appropriate for each patient.
- · Assess commonly over-looked diagnostic evidence in primary care.
- Defend the rationale for the selection of different therapies based upon currently available evidence-based information and individual patient consideration.
- Classify the recommended uses, unique characteristics, side effects, interactions, dosage and costs of new medications, as well as other considerations.

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This intensive three-day course includes a review and update on major subject areas in family medicine. The course is taught by more than 20 faculty members selected for their expertise in areas related to the successful delivery of family health care and patient outcomes.

The University of Oklahoma College of Medicine faculty is nationally recognized for its expertise in the management of complex conditions that is unavailable elsewhere in the state, region or sometimes even the nation.

This is a very fast-paced course in which most speakers will be utilizing an audience response system, which provides participants with immediate feedback of their knowledge and the opportunity to reinforce comprehension and retention of key learning objectives. Each session will include time for questions and answers. The course combines best-practice strategies and education through case studies and lectures. A complete syllabus including all presentations is provided online as a resource for today's office practice.

**COURSE PURPOSE:** The purpose of this educational activity is to improve the care of patients seen in primary care settings by closing common clinical practice gaps that have been identified across the country.

**INTENDED AUDIENCE AND SCOPE OF PRACTICE:** This activity is intended for family physicians, general internists, physician assistants, advanced practice nurses and other health care professionals who provide primary care to patients.

# CURRENT CME TRAINING ON THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC

In partnership with the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (ODMHSAS), the University of Oklahoma Health Science Center (OUHSC) and the OU-TU School of Community Medicine have created a comprehensive six module CME program called **Do No Harm: Putting Safer Pain Management Into Practices**.
